Reporting Student Absences/Safe Arrival

We will continue the Safe Arrival Program which allows parents to report student absences for the current day prior to bell time which is 8:50 a.m., as well as future absences via the internet or telephone. Please be aware that if you do not report your child's absence you will receive automated phone calls and emails requesting your confirmation that you are aware of your child's absence and to provide an explanation for the **absence**.





As we continue to take a proactive approach to make our school a safe environment for our students with life-threatening food allergies, please be reminded that the school is a Nut-Safe environment. It is a good practice to wash your hands thoroughly before and after each meal to avoid cross contamination, particularly after breakfast, before coming to school.

We would like to remind parents that in keeping with our School Allergy Awareness Plan, loot bags containing treats or, any food items for sharing/distribution are NOT allowed in the school. You are most welcome to bring in non-food items (e.g. class book, pencils, erasers) to celebrate a special occasion such as a birthday. We thank you for your continued effort in keeping our school a safe environment for all our students.

Medication

If your child requires medication (prescribed by a physician), please notify the school and complete the necessary S16A form (available at the office). All medication must be sent to the office for safekeeping. Please note that medication cannot be administered by Administration without completing required forms.

Classroom organization: 2018-2019

The process for formation of classes for September 2018 will soon begin. The first step in this process is to determine class organization consistent with Board, Ministry and contract guidelines. Our goal is to create balanced classes to provide effective working groups which will benefit all children in each class as much as possible. In forming classes, teachers, special education staff, along with the Principal will carefully consider the following criteria:

-learning styles -academic abilities -social groupings -special education needs -English as a Second Language -behavioural needs -balance of male/female -general dynamics within the class -student experience in combined classes -balance of maturity levels

You can surely appreciate that creating the best and most functional class groupings possible is a task which requires much thought and careful planning and should be left to the discretion of the school staff. Accepting parental requests for specific teachers would not be in the best interest of all children in the school as it could restrict school staff in forming what we consider to be the most ideal classroom groupings. Teachers who have been working with the students all year in their classrooms know them well and will make determinations of placement in their best interests.

Should you wish to share additional information relative to the considerations lists above, please write a letter to the Principal's attention by no later than May 22, 2018. Verbal information cannot be accepted. Specific teacher requests are not to be included in the letter. Please remember that the final decision for student placement and school organizations remains the responsibility of the Principal.

Weather Conditions & Sun Protection

Students are asked to dress appropriately for the weather conditions of the day. This includes wearing rain gear, sun hats, and rain boots. They are also asked to change into their indoor shoes before entering the classroom. It is also very important to please send extra socks and a change of clothes for wet weather.

Sunny days and wet weather are ahead. Students may spend up to 2 hours outside in a school day. Please ensure that your child puts some SPF on in the morning before leaving for school. Since SPF is only effective if it is put on 20 minutes before exposure to sun, it is important that they put it on before coming to school.



Recess Rules

We encourage all students to experience their recess outdoor breaks in an enjoyable and safe manner.

However, we would like to remind all students not to bring any hard playing balls in order to ensure the safety of all students.

Also we would like to remind all students to follow these very important rules in the school yard:





Drop Off Zone

Drivers are reminded to continue to be cautious of students who are crossing the sidewalk on either side of the loop and to obey the stop sign which is located at the end of the loop.

Please do not pass vehicles that are unloading students. **Treat it like a**

"drive thru". Please move your vehicle as close as you can to the stop sign, rather than stopping in front of the doors when unloading your child even if there are no cars in front of you. Also please do not enter/exit the parking lot at the end of the day. Thank you all for your cooperation.
